

LETTER FROM DON EVERARD ON HUMAN CONCERNS

Dear Fellow Parishioners:

Criminal Justice reform has filled the newspapers, TV news, talk shows, and social media in the several weeks here in Louisiana. The following are some of my thoughts about the results of the legislature's Special Session on Criminal Justice.

It was with great sadness that I followed the proceedings of the recent Special Legislative Session on its Criminal Justice reform in Baton Rouge. What hurt most was hearing about our state's dismantling of the 2017 reforms wasn't because the reforms weren't working, but because they were working. The reforms included adding electrocution and nitrogen asphyxiation to the state's repertoire for state sponsored killing is intended to make it easier to enforce the death penalty. Expect death row to soon become active again. Rightfully, this has gotten the most media attention, but other bills will negatively impact a much wider group of people.

Eliminating pardons and cutting back on good time will increase the amount of time people are incarcerated. It will also increase the number of people in prison at any given time. Good time and pardons are valuable strategies to encourage inmates to follow the rules, to take part in available rehab activities, and to make other positive changes in their lives. Consequently, eliminating parole and good time served will result in more disciplinary problems for prison staff in charge of custody, care and control.

The 2017 reforms to the criminal justice system resulted in fewer people in prison and less money spent on incarceration. For example, much of the money saved was reallocated to crime prevention and re-entry programs designed to help people to successfully transition from prison, back into society. Additionally, those funds will surely have to go back to paying for the incarceration of people, once again.

Moreover, religious leaders of many faiths, including our Catholic bishops, supported the 2017 reforms. During the special session they continued to speak against much of what our state's new administration had proposed. They also challenged elected officials to remember that people who do wrong, who act violently, are still children of God; that they hate sin, but not the sinner, and that they focus on rehabilitation rather than, punishment; and that they temper their justice and mercy. However, our newly elected officials were not convinced.

Blessed are the victims of crime who are able, through prayer, to forgive those who caused them harm. Blessed are the victims of crime who struggle with anger and vengeance. Blessed are the perpetrators of harm, that they acknowledge the harm they have caused, seek forgiveness, and change their ways. Blessed are the families and loved ones of the incarcerated, who also suffer. Blessed are our elected officials who continue to struggle to balance justice and mercy. And dear God, bless us all with gifts of hope and compassion, as we struggle with the reality of crime in our state.



Save St. Mary's Assumption Church Restoration Capital Campaign

St. Mary's is one of the most beautiful and historic churches in New Orleans. It is also the final resting placed of Blessed Francis Seelos, a Redemptorist priest who ministered to his parish, especially those who were sick and dying of the yellow fever epidemic. Because of heroic care for others, he contracted the illness himself and died of it. His selfless dedication has placed him on the path to sainthood in the Catholic Church.

After 164 years of age and climate – which is hot, humid, and vulnerable to hurricanes – have taken a toll on St. Mary's. As a result, the church has sustained serious damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling.
