LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

"Why is this night different from all other nights?

On this night of every year, we attend the Easter Vigil in a Church.

On this night of every year, we have a procession with the Easter candle.

On this night of every year, we sing hymns while we stand next to our loved ones.

On this night of every year, we celebrate and welcome our loved ones into the Church"

Many of us celebrate Easter differently and in our own way. Some may be missing from the table as they fight an illness alone in a hospital, while relatives and friends long to be with them in person. Some will be mourning their loved ones who lost their battle to cancer, and it is time to plan their funeral. Some will be going to work on Easter, to provide food for their families as they fear hunger of their crying children. Some will be terrified about what may happen when they cannot pay their monthly rent or the thought of being evicted.

Why is this night different from all other nights?

Because on this night, we acclaim the Alleluia and let the light of the risen Christ shine through the darkness.

We think we know about Easter and the resurrection, but Easter is not only about what happened to Jesus, but to a great degree, it is about what happens to us, as our lives are transformed by His rising.

Paul speaks about Christians being so united with Christ that when He dies, we die with Him. And when He is raised, so we are, too. We not only await final transformation but every time we stand with the crucified peoples of our day, as did Mary Magdalene and the other Mary, the Risen One is alive in us as we break the hold of death-dealing powers even, now.

My brothers and sisters, the Risen One is alive in us, as we break the hold of death and we too, rise. We rise from the pain of losing a loved one, we rise from terror and fear from our current situations, we rise to fight what is holding us down, and we rise to give each other hope and comfort.

Let the Easter **joy** awake in us as Christ raises us to a new life beyond this present death.




St. Mary's Updates:

Save St. Mary's: PHASE 1—EXTERIOR—\$2.1 million has been raised! Scaffolding has gone up on the exterior of St. Mary's in preparation for Phase 1 to restore the outside of the church including: removal of foliage, roots; removal and relocation of bird nests and bee hives; replacing damaged brick and mortar and replacing with the new historically appropriate mortar; applying water repellant to coat and seal bricks; repairing and repainting window frames. The exterior work is expected to take approximately 18 months. We will keep you updated as the restoration process continues.

Save St. Mary's Assumption Church Restoration Capital Campaign

St. Mary's is one of the most beautiful and historic churches in New Orleans. It is also the final resting placed of Blessed Francis Seelos, a Redemptorist priest who ministered to his parish, especially those who were sick and dying of the yellow fever epidemic. Because of heroic care for others, he contracted the illness himself and died of it. His selfless dedication has placed him on the path to sainthood in the Catholic Church.

After 164 years of age and climate — which is hot, humid, and vulnerable to hurricanes — have taken a toll on St. Mary's. As a result, the church has sustained serious damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling.

As stewards of this treasure and being deeply devoted to the legacy of Blessed Francis Seelos, the Redemptorists of the parish are raising the necessary funds to preserve this beautiful church. Their "Save St. Mary's Campaign Committee" is organizing and directing efforts to restore St. Mary's to its original beauty, while fortifying the structure for future generations.
