LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last Sunday we had a very successful and exciting Family Day! There were a lot of food to sample, children playing games and running around enjoying the beautiful weather. Then, when it was time for the pinata games, the children anxiously awaited their turn for a chance to get candy. This *joyous event* showed the meaning of love in our community and church families.

I want to express my gratitude and thanks to all the volunteers and to everyone who participated in helping out with Family Day. It is truly a moment of grace to witness the **joy** in the Gospel in every little thing that we do. We also had a successful small raffle and we were happy to give away gift baskets to five winners: Jane Cross, Connie Berbuesse, Kathleen Frater, Elizabeth Martin, and Mike Boudreaux. Congratulations!

I have some exciting news for the parish and the Seelos Shrine — Fr. Steve Benden, C.Ss.R., is going to be arriving soon, and he will be a new member of our Redemptorist Community in New Orleans. Fr. Steve is expected to arrive in the second week of November and he will continue on with the mission of the Redemptorist in New Orleans to serve the people of God in the parish, the Blessed Seelos Shrine, and St. Alphonsus School. On October 24th, Pope Francis issued the fourth encyclical of his pontificate, entitled, *Dilexit nos* ("He Loved Us"). I found this particular passage to be quite beautiful and meaningful for all of us to reflect on the readings for this weekend as follows:

This profound core, present in every man and woman, is not that of the soul, but of the entire person in his or her unique psychosomatic identity. Everything finds its unity in the heart, which can be the dwelling-place of love in all its-spiritual, psychic and even physical dimensions. In a word, if love reigns in our heart, we become, in a complete and luminous way, the persons we are meant to be, for every human being is created above all else for love. In the deepest fiber of our being, we were made to love and to be loved. (20).

In many ways, I find that our choices to love go beyond personal and individual responses. With a heightened awareness in our time that all creation is interrelated, all beings and Earth itself are created to be in a communion of love, structural and systemic actions which foster that unity are needed. I believe loving your neighbor involves making choices collectively which prioritize those who are poorest and most affected by inequities in our social structures. As we listen to the voices of our near and distant neighbors along with Earth and all of its creatures asking us, "Do you love me?" we will be able to discern what we need to do. Through the intercession of Our Mother of Perpetual Help, may we live and act for the Reign of God.





Save St. Mary's Assumption Church Restoration Capital Campaign

St. Mary's is one of the most beautiful and historic churches in New Orleans. It is also the final resting placed of Blessed Francis Seelos, a Redemptorist priest who ministered to his parish, especially those who were sick and dying of the yellow fever epidemic. Because of heroic care for others, he contracted the illness himself and died of it. His selfless dedication has placed him on the path to sainthood in the Catholic Church.

164 years of age and climate—which is hot, humid, and vulnerable to hurricanes—have taken a toll on St. Mary's. As a result, the church has sustained serious damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling.

As stewards of this treasure and being deeply devoted to the legacy of Blessed Francis Seelos, the Redemptorists of the parish are raising the necessary funds to preserve this beautiful church. The "Save St. Mary's Campaign Committee" is organizing and directing efforts to restore St. Mary's to its original beauty, while fortifying the structure for future generations.
