

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This Sunday culminates our lectionary cycle, closing Ordinary Time for Year B and preparing us for the coming *Season of Advent*. Think of Christ the King as our liturgical New Year's Eve. We stand at the end of another year of worship. These end-time-themed Scriptures often advise us to be "sober and alert", "watch", be prepared and make good use of this time. But with this weekend's readings, our vision is widened. Revelations speak of Jesus as ruler of all of the kings of the earth. The Johannine Jesus announces that his kingdom is not of this world. As the title of this Sunday appropriately states, we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

The image of Christ the King has been with us since Pilate's interrogation of Jesus in the Passion events. Jesus doesn't claim kingship; rather, he stresses he came to "testify to the truth". He claims those who belong to the truth listen to his voice. This is because the truth is relational. It calls for engagement and commitment. In truth, we who listen to Jesus are betrothed to him. We assist in building the Reign of Jesus, where we are engaged with and committed to God and to our neighbor in love.

Therefore, this commitment has been practiced by Christians for two millenia, mostly without having an official feast or teaching of the heart of Jesus until Pope Pius XI's Quas Primas (1925), where he gave us the feast we are celebrating today, the last Sunday of the Liturgical calendar. The pope was responding to growing tensions between the Church and national secularization movements which caused national persecutions of Christians in Europe, Middle East, and America. The same tensions still exist in today's world and we can add several more places to the list.

Ultimately, the Feast of Christ the King was created to answer the question, "Who is in charge here?" It is Christ the King who oversees all creation and everything, and everyone in it. We claim it and celebrate it today, but "long live Christ the King". This Feast day should be an invitation to join our hearts to the Sacred Heart of Jesus in building his Reign of peace and justice in our time and place. Pope Francis stated, "What kind of worship would we give to Christ if we were to rest content with an individual relationship with him and show no interest in relieving the sufferings of others or helping them to live a better life?" The Pope reminds us that love has the capacity to inflame the hearts of others in love. Loving others is our witness to Christ the King who in his incarnation, ministry, passion, death, and resurrection, revealed to us.

As we celebrate Jesus Christ as the one who oversees our lives and actions, we are also invited to become engaged and committed to the mission of Jesus, in such a way, that our love will inflame love in others. In this way, we extend and build up the Reign of our Lord in our parish, community and family.

Through the intercession of Our Mother's Perpetual Help, may we live and act for the Reign of God.



MINISTRY WITH YOUNG ADULTS



Save St. Mary's Assumption Church Restoration Capital Campaign

St. Mary's is one of the most beautiful and historic churches in New Orleans. It is also the final resting placed of Blessed Francis Seelos, a Redemptorist priest who ministered to his parish, especially those who were sick and dying of the yellow fever epidemic. Because of heroic care for others, he contracted the illness himself and died of it. His selfless dedication has placed him on the path to sainthood in the Catholic Church.

164 years of age and climate—which is hot, humid, and vulnerable to hurricanes—have taken a toll on St. Mary's. As a result, the church has sustained serious damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling.
