LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are about to begin a new season of Lent. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. We receive ashes on our foreheads, as a reminder that we are dust, and to dust we shall return (Gen. 3:19). As I reflect on my life in the past few months, and a few experiences, including witnessing a friend dying, I'm reminded of how precious life is. We are the dust that is precious, destined for eternal life. We are also, God's hope, his treasures and his creations.

I'm also reminded, that life is short. The phrase, "life is short" serves as a reminder of our limited time on Earth and it encourages us to focus on our relationship with God and with each other. This phrase, also *prompts action*, it encourages us to cherish our time with our loved ones, to enjoy quality time with those we love, and care for, and most importantly, to focus on God.

Lent is a time to reflect, renew and to repent. It's a journey of hope in our faith to repent our sins and to prepare for the celebration of Easter, and Christ's resurrection. It sets the tone for an opportunity for spiritual growth.

I close with these thoughts, Pope Francis once said in his Lenten homily, "let us look inside, into our hearts." He reflected on Jesus' invitation for us to "go into your inner room", urging believers of Christ to focus on one's heart, and genuine relationship with God. During this season of Lent, and Jubilee year of hope, let us return to God with all our heart, and renew our commitment to living according to Christ's teachings. The Jubilee year, "Pilgrims of Hope"- also referred to as the 'Holy Year', may we open our hearts in preparation for the Paschal Mystery of Christ's dying and rising. Let us allow God to transform our hearts and experience the unconditional love he has for us.


