Letter from Fr. Aaron Meszaros, C.Ss.R.

In my time serving as pastoral associate here at St. Alphonsus Parish, I watched day after day as the parking lot filled with cars bringing pilgrims of all walks of life, ages, cultures, languages, and backgrounds, from both near and far, to visit with Blessed Seelos and to ask his intercession.

And yet, for those of us who worship in these walls, Sunday after Sunday, sometimes it's easy to forget the gift that is in our midst. The gift before us is a Redemptorist missionary, so beloved by both his fellow Redemptorists and the people of this faith community that they called him a saint even at his deathbed. The people of this community were so touched by his life lived with such love, that they went from praying with him and for him, to praying *to* him for his intercession in their daily lives.

I'm not quite certain we've ever had a Seelos Healing Mass during Lent before. Yet , with the celebration of Seelos' 25th anniversary of beatification, it seems fitting that we celebrate even amid this Lenten season. Lent of course is a penitential season. But penance does not preclude celebration. It makes celebration more focused on the gifts God gives us. Indeed, Lent ushers us directly into celebration at the empty tomb!

Today, we celebrate. We celebrate our brother Redemptorist who rests in our midst, for his life well lived. We celebrate his dedication to God, and his dedication to proclaiming God's mercy and love. We celebrate the total gift of himself as a witness to that same love. We celebrate his continued intercession and the experience of peace and wholeness so many have known through his witness.

To all of the parishioners of St. Alphonsus Parish: Thank you for celebrating with us.



Save St. Mary's Assumption Church Restoration Capital Campaign

St. Mary's is one of the most beautiful and historic churches in New Orleans. It is also the final resting placed of Blessed Francis Seelos, a Redemptorist priest who ministered to his parish, especially those who were sick and dying of the yellow fever epidemic. Because of heroic care for others, he contracted the illness himself and died of it. His selfless dedication has placed him on the path to sainthood in the Catholic Church.

After 164 years of age and climate – which is hot, humid, and vulnerable to hurricanes – have taken a toll on St. Mary's. As a result, the church has sustained serious damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling.
