

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Our journey during the Holy Week.

Holy Week is not just a sequence of sacred days—it's a mirror for the journey of discipleship. It draws us into the mystery of Jesus's final days and reveals what it truly means to follow Him.

We begin with **Palm Sunday**, where the crowds welcome Jesus with enthusiasm. It's a moment of public celebration, yet we know it leads to the cross. In discipleship, we too, may start with passion and joy, moved by Jesus' presence and the hope, He brings. But just as the week unfolds, so does our journey—into challenges that test our faith.

Holy Thursday teaches us that discipleship requires humility and service. Jesus kneels to wash the feet of His followers, even the one who would betray Him. He redefines greatness as self-giving love. As His disciples, we are called to serve without pride, to love even when it's uncomfortable or undeserved.

Good Friday is the heart of the cost of discipleship. Here, we confront the reality that following Jesus means carrying the cross. It means remaining faithful through suffering, rejection, and even silence from God. The disciples struggled here—fleeing, denying, hiding. And yet, Jesus remained faithful to them. His mercy shows us that failure is not the end, but part of the journey.

Holy Saturday is the day of waiting. The tomb is closed, hope feels lost, and yet, something sacred is happening in the silence. For the disciple, it's a reminder that growth often happens in the in-between-spaces — when we're unsure, yet still choose to trust.

And finally, **Easter Sunday** breaks through the darkness. The Resurrection reveals the goal of discipleship—not just suffering, but *transformation*. To follow Jesus is to die to ourselves and to rise into a new way of being—one marked by joy, freedom, and mission.

The journey of discipleship, like Holy Week, is full of ups and downs, doubts and grace, fear and love. But in walking it with Jesus, we are not alone. We are being formed, day by day, into His likeness.

So, this Holy Week, may we walk closely with Him—not just to remember, but to be changed. May we like the first disciples, stumble and rise again, always moving forward in faith, toward the empty tomb and the life it promises.





Save St. Mary's Assumption Church Restoration Capital Campaign

St. Mary's is one of the most beautiful and historic churches in New Orleans. It is also the final resting placed of Blessed Francis Seelos, a Redemptorist priest who ministered to his parish, especially those who were sick and dying of the yellow fever epidemic. Because of heroic care for others, he contracted the illness himself and died of it. His selfless dedication has placed him on the path to sainthood in the Catholic Church.

After 164 years of age and climate — which is hot, humid, and vulnerable to hurricanes — have taken a toll on St. Mary's. As a result, the church has sustained serious damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling.

As stewards of this treasure and being deeply devoted to the legacy of Blessed Francis Seelos, the Redemptorists of the parish are raising the necessary funds to preserve this beautiful church. Their "Save St. Mary's Campaign Committee" is organizing and directing efforts to restore St. Mary's to its original beauty, while fortifying the structure for future generations.
