## LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

As we remember the life and witness of the late Pope Francis, we are invited not only to honor his memory, but to reflect on the path of discipleship he showed us, one shaped by humility, mercy, and a heart open to all.

From the moment he stepped onto the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica and asked for the people's blessing before offering his own, it was clear that this would be a different kind of papacy. He chose the name "Francis" in honor of St. Francis of Assisi, the saint of simplicity, poverty, and peace which led to a decision which would become the cornerstone of his vision for discipleship. Pope Francis reminded us that being a disciple of Jesus is not about titles or honors, but about service. He would often call the Church to go out into the streets, to the forgotten, to the places where pain lives and hope flickers. Like Jesus, Pope Francis walked toward the broken, and he met people where they were.

The Holy Father often spoke of the Church as a "field hospital after battle", reminding us that discipleship is not about building walls, but about walking with people in their wounds and complexities. He would urge pastors to "smell like the sheep", a powerful metaphor for incarnational ministry and genuine closeness. Discipleship, for Pope Francis was never about lofty detachments but rather about gritty solidarity. Perhaps, the defining theme of his papacy was mercy.


The Jubilee Year of Mercy (2015-2016) was not just a calendar event; it was a theological heartbeat of his leadership. He consistently prioritized God's boundless forgiveness over legalism. In doing so, he modeled a Christ-centered approach which invited all people; especially, those estranged from the Church into a journey of healing and belonging. And his concerns for the "peripheries" be they geographic, social or existential was another hallmark of his discipleship vision. Also, he reminded us that Jesus is found not in the power and privilege but in the faces of migrants, prisoners, the homeless, and those suffering. Pope Francis didn't advocate for them from afar; instead, he visited them, embraced them, and lifted their spirits before the world.

With *Laudato Si*, Pope Francis expanded the traditional understanding of discipleship to include care for our common home. He rooted ecological concern in Christian faith, calling followers of Christ to be stewards of creation, protectors of life in all its forms. He challenged a consumerist culture that valued profit over people and the planet. Francis championed a Church that listens. Through the Synod on Synodality and his commitment to dialogue – he fostered a discipleship that was communal, participatory, and discerning. He also called the Church to walk together – not in uniformity, but in unity, embracing the voices of the laity, women, youth, and marginalized communities.

In closing, Pope Francis said, "Let us not forget the three key words: please, thank you, and sorry". Maybe discipleship begins in small things like these words which can help build bridges, not walls. It is a challenge to each of us: to live humbly, love boldly, include generosity, and to listen deeply. His papacy reminds us all - that to follow Christ is, to go where He went, to the poor, to the forgotten, and to the wounded, and to do so with joy, simplicity, and mercy. As we reflect on Pope Francis's life and leadership, may we not merely admire his witness, but embody it.





## Save St. Mary's Assumption Church Restoration Capital Campaign
