# LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"This is how all will know that you are my disciples." John 13:34-35.

Graduation is often seen as a moment of arrival, a milestone that marks the completion of a journey. And while it certainly celebrates hard work, growth, and perseverance, it also quietly whispers a deeper truth: this is not the end, but the beginning. Let us not forget that the very word "commencement" means "a beginning". While this chapter of learning and formation may be closing, a new one is opening. It is a new mission to live out our faith as the disciples of Jesus.

As followers of Christ, we understand that every stage of learning involves preparation, not just for careers or accomplishments, but for vocation. So, as we celebrate a graduation of a loved one, let it also be a commissioning. Let it mark not only what we have achieved, but what we are now entrusted to give. May we go forward in faith with no fear, not to be served, but to serve others as disciples on a mission for Christ.







# Save St. Mary's Assumption Church Restoration Capital Campaign

St. Mary's is one of the most beautiful and historic churches in New Orleans. It is also the final resting placed of Blessed Francis Seelos, a Redemptorist priest who ministered to his parish, especially those who were sick and dying of the yellow fever epidemic. Because of heroic care for others, he contracted the illness himself and died of it. His selfless dedication has placed him on the path to sainthood in the Catholic Church.

After 164 years of age and climate — which is hot, humid, and vulnerable to hurricanes — have taken a toll on St. Mary's. As a result, the church has sustained serious damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling.

As stewards of this treasure and being deeply devoted to the legacy of Blessed Francis Seelos, the Redemptorists of the parish are raising the necessary funds to preserve this beautiful church. Their "Save St. Mary's Campaign Committee" is organizing and directing efforts to restore St. Mary's to its original beauty, while fortifying the structure for future generations.
