LETTER FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

This past Friday, August 1st we celebrated the feast day of St. Alphonsus Liguori. St. Alphonsus is the founder of the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, most commonly known as the Redemptorists.

St. Alphonsus was born on September 27, 1696 at Marianella, a sector of Naples, to an aristocratic family. By the age of 16, he was a practicing lawyer, well known and respected. Becoming disillusioned and unhappy with the practice of law, he became a priest in 1726. As a priest, he worked with the homeless and poor of Naples, and the surrounding area.

The congregation, he came to love and to cherish, was founded on November 9, 1732 in a small town called Scala, located on the Amalfi coast of Italy. With his first followers, St. Alphonsus traveled from village to village, preaching and praying to the poor people. He also wrote many books and pamphlets, a total of about 111, notably "The Glories of Mary" and "The Practice of the Love of Jesus Christ."

St. Alphonsus died on August 1, 1787 at the age of 91. He was canonized a saint by Pope Gregory XVI on May 26, 1839. Later, Pope Pius IX made him a Doctor of the Church and Pope Pius XII declared him patron of confessors and moral theologians.

Today, the congregation that he founded, the Redemptorists have nearly 4,473 members world-wide. They serve on every continent in over 80 countries. They serve the Church as preachers in parishes and retreat houses. They operate publishing houses in different parts of the world, continuing to spread the written word far and wide, as did St. Alphonsus.

In conclusion, I ask that you as members of the parish and by extension members of the Redemptorist family, to pray for us and continue to help us imitate St. Alphonsus.

On behalf of myself, Fr. Chung, Fr. Steve, Fr. Tim, and Fr. Joseph, we thank you for your support and many prayers. Through the intercession of St. Alphonsus, may God bless you.

Because of heroic care for others, he contracted the illness himself and died of it. His selfless dedication has placed him on the path to sainthood in the Catholic Church.

After 164 years of age and climate — which is hot, humid, and vulnerable to hurricanes — have taken a toll on St. Mary's. As a result, the church has sustained serious damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling.

As stewards of this treasure and being deeply devoted to the legacy of Blessed Francis Seelos, the Redemptorists of the parish are raising the necessary funds to preserve this beautiful church.
