

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." Lk: 13:24.

As students return to their classrooms, they are reminded that learning takes effort, patience, and perseverance. Success in school doesn't come by accident—it requires studying, practicing, and sometimes even failure before growth. In many ways, discipleship is the same. Among many items to help the student's success in school that many of us don't really think about until we need it. That one thing they pick up is their backpack. It carries books, notebooks, supplies, and everything needed for learning. Sometimes, it feels heavy. But students carry it each day because they know it is part of their journey toward growth and knowledge. Their perseverance, patience, and hard work is to, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate." (Lk: 13:24).


In the same way, **discipleship means carrying our "backpack of faith."** Jesus said: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves, take up their cross daily, and follow me" (*Lk*: 9:23). Just as a backpack is filled with the tools for learning, discipleship asks us to carry with us the tools of prayer, Scripture, love, patience, and service. At times, these responsibilities may feel heavy, but they are necessary for spiritual growth.

Working hard in school requires discipline. Students must do homework, prepare for exams, and sometimes struggle through difficult lessons. In discipleship, we also work hard, choosing kindness over anger, forgiveness over revenge, and faith over fear. Like schoolwork, discipleship requires effort, but the reward is wisdom, maturity, and closeness with Christ.

The good news is that students are never alone in carrying their backpacks, and sometimes their friends help, or teachers lighten the load. In the same way, we do not carry our discipleship journey alone. Christ walks with us, saying, "Come to me, all who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" (Mt: 11:28).

This back-to-school season, let the backpack remind us that discipleship means carrying the weight of faith with courage and commitment. Working hard in studies prepares the mind for the future; working hard in discipleship prepares the soul for eternity. And even when the load feels heavy, we can trust that Christ, our teacher, walks beside us and helps us carry it.


20th Anniversary of Hurricane Katrina Events!

We are making progress on the exterior renovations! Save St. Mary's Assumption Church Restoration Capital Campaign

St. Mary's is one of the most beautiful and historic churches in New Orleans. It is also the final resting placed of Blessed Francis Seelos, a Redemptorist priest who ministered to his parish, especially those who were sick and dying of the yellow fever epidemic. Because of heroic care for others, he contracted the illness himself and died of it. His selfless dedication has placed him on the path to sainthood in the Catholic Church.

After 164 years of age and climate — which is hot, humid, and vulnerable to hurricanes — have taken a toll on St. Mary's. As a result, the church has sustained serious damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling.

As stewards of this treasure and being deeply devoted to the legacy of Blessed Francis Seelos, the Redemptorists of the parish are raising the necessary funds to preserve this beautiful church. Their "Save St. Mary's Campaign Committee" is organizing and directing efforts to restore St. Mary's to its original beauty, while fortifying the structure for future generations.
