LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear brothers and sisters,

We celebrate **Mercy Sunday** *along with the Sisters of Mercy*, a day when the Church reminds us that the heart of the Gospel is God's endless mercy, offered to each of us through Jesus Christ. And the parable of the rich man and Lazarus gives us a powerful image of what happens when we accept or refuse that mercy.

The rich man lived surrounded by comfort, yet everyday he walked past Lazarus, a poor man suffering at his very gate. He did not notice Lazarus, or perhaps he chose not to notice. His heart was closed. And when death came, it revealed the truth: Lazarus was carried to the embrace of Abraham, while the rich man was left with emptiness and regret.

The great chasm in the story is not only about the afterlife, but it is about the chasm which forms in our hearts when we refuse compassion, when we fail to see the suffering Christ in our neighbor. That chasm grows wider each time we ignore mercy, until one day, it may be too late.


But today, Jesus stands at the gate of our lives, not with accusation but with mercy. On this feast, He says to us: "Come to Me. Do not be afraid of your sins. My mercy is greater than your failures." Just as Lazarus was lifted into eternal comfort, so too, will Christ lift us and if only, we open our hearts to Him, and to one another.

The message is simple: to receive mercy is to give mercy. We cannot ask God for forgiveness and then close our eyes to the poor, the sick, the lonely, the broken. Mercy must flow through us, or else it dies within us. We have seen the works of the Sister of Mercy's ministries in our neighborhood and in our school for over 150 years. They give witness to all of us of what it means to receive mercy and to give mercy.

So, when we trust God, this means not only believing in His forgiveness, but also daring to live as instruments of His mercy in our families, in our communities, and toward the "Lazarus" who waits at our gate.

May this Mercy Sunday not pass us by as the rich man passed Lazarus. But rather, let it awaken us to mercy that saves, heals and gives life.



St. Mary's is one of the most beautiful and historic churches in New Orleans. It is also the final resting placed of Blessed Francis Seelos, a Redemptorist priest who ministered to his parish, especially those who were sick and dying of the yellow fever epidemic. Because of heroic care for others, he contracted the illness himself and died of it. His selfless dedication has placed him on the path to sainthood in the Catholic Church.

After 164 years of age and climate — which is hot, humid, and vulnerable to hurricanes — have taken a toll on St. Mary's. As a result, the church has sustained serious damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling.

As stewards of this treasure and being deeply devoted to the legacy of Blessed Francis Seelos, the Redemptorists of the parish are raising the necessary funds to preserve this beautiful church. Their "Save St. Mary's Campaign Committee" is organizing and directing efforts to restore St. Mary's to its original beauty, while fortifying the structure for future generations.
