

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear brothers and sisters,

Happy Feast Day of Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos! This year is special, because it is also the **25th Anniversary of Seelos' Beatification**. Twenty-five years ago, Father Francis X. Seelos was declared, **"Blessed"** by Pope John Paul II, on April 9, 2000. Today, we celebrate his feast on October 5.

As we remember and celebrate the life of Blessed Seelos, I want to reflect on this prayer: "O God, you make your priest, Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos, outstanding in love, that he might proclaim the mysteries of redemption and comfort those in affliction. Grant by his intercession, that we may work zealously for your glory and for the salvation of all. We ask this through our Lord, Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. Amen."

Blessed Seelos was born on January 11, 1819 in Fussen, Bavaria, Germany. Drawn to the missionary zeal of the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (Redemptorists), he joined their community and would later travel to America and then on to New Orleans in 1866, where he was assigned to serve the German-speaking immigrants at St. Mary's Assumption Church. He courageously chose to come to New Orleans at a time when the city was struck by a devastating epidemic of yellow fever, and despite knowing the dangerous risks—he joyfully accepted his new assignment and arrived in New Orleans in 1866. And he cared and ministered to the sick, shortly after arriving here. Sadly, within a year of serving our community, Father Seelos died on October 4, 1867, at the young age of 48 of yellow fever.

While Father Seelos only served our community for a short while, he healed and touched so many lives that he served. And he served with a joyous heart, and with a heart of charism. He ministered to the poor, the sick, and to those who felt most abandoned by society. And he was never afraid to enter homes of the sick and to offer comfort, and prayers when he could. His tomb is in our beautiful Church, and his relics are in our reliquary at the National Shrine of Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos, here on our church's property; the very grounds that Father Seelos walked, talked, prayed, and preached.

Although, Blessed Seelos' life and ministry may have been cut short — his lasting impact on those he ministered to, to those he touched and to those he healed remains, today. The National Shrine of Blessed Seelos here at St. Mary's Assumption Church, continues to receive and to greet thousands of pilgrims each year, from the city, from around the United States, and from around the world — who come to pray for the intercession of Blessed Seelos in their needs. As we continue to welcome pilgrims, parishioners, friends, and neighbors this Sunday, October 5 to the Vietnamese-Speaking Seelos Healing Mass — at 3pm and on next Saturday, October 11 to the English-Speaking Seelos Healing Mass at 4pm at St. Mary's Assumption Church — I pray that through the intercession of Blessed Seelos and our almighty God that all of your prayers and petitions are answered.



The Prayer for the Canonization of Blessed Father Seelos



O my God, I truly believe You are present with me. I adore your bountiful goodness. I thank You for the graces and gifts You gave to Father Seelos. If it is Your Holy Will, please let him be Declared a Saint of the Church so that others may know and imitate his holy life. Amen.

Francis Xavier Seelos, C.Ss.R. was born on January 11, 1819 in Fussen, Bavaria, Germany. Having expressed a desire for the priesthood since childhood, he entered the diocesan seminary in 1842 after completing his studies in philosophy. He joined the Most Holy Redeemer (Redemptorists) and he came to America in 1843. He was ordained on December 22, 1844. Three years after his ordination, he was appointed Master of Novices and spent one third of his priestly life training future priests. In 1860, Bishop O'Connor wanted to make him Bishop of Pittsburgh, but he asked to be able to remain a humble priest. His request was granted. He transferred to New Orleans in 1866, and he

contracted Yellow Fever while caring and ministering to the sick, and he died on October 4, 1867.

Many miracles are attributed to him both during his life and after his death.

St. Mary's is one of the most beautiful and historic churches in New Orleans. It is also the final resting placed of Blessed Francis Seelos, a Redemptorist priest who ministered to his parish, especially those who were sick and dying of the yellow fever epidemic. Because of heroic care for others, he contracted the illness himself and died of it. His selfless dedication has placed him on the path to sainthood in the Catholic Church.

After 164 years of age and climate — which is hot, humid, and vulnerable to hurricanes — have taken a toll on St. Mary's. As a result, the church has sustained serious damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling.

As stewards of this treasure and being deeply devoted to the legacy of Blessed Francis Seelos, the Redemptorists of the parish are raising the necessary funds to preserve this beautiful church. Their "Save St. Mary's Campaign Committee" is organizing and directing efforts to restore St. Mary's to its original beauty, while fortifying the structure for future generations.
