

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear brothers and sisters of Christ,

When I am asked to describe St. Mary's Assumption Church and the parish, several things come to my mind. First, I tell people, When I look around our parish, I see a beautiful mosaic — faces from every culture, voices that carry different accents, and hearts that beat with a shared faith. I see not one kind of family but many—young families with children, elders whose faith has endured through decades, single adults, lifelong parishioners whose family roots run deep in the community. Together, we form a living portrait of what it means to be a family of God.

Family, at its heart, is more than those we share a surname with. It is the place where we learn love, patience, forgiveness, and faith. For some, family is large and extended; for others, it may be a few close friends who have walked beside them through life's joys and struggles. In our parish, I see a family made up of parish members, volunteers and neighbors.

When Christ gathered his disciples, he called those who were different, those who came from different backgrounds, and those who had no family of their own. Yet, he welcomed them to follow him. In our small parish, I see the same opportunity — to be a home for all, where every person is welcomed, known by name and valued as a brother and a sister of Christ.



And to welcome a stranger as Christ Himself, knowing that every person who walks through our door is already a part of God's family.

The front of the Church is looking like new again! Save St. Mary's Assumption Church Restoration Capital Campaign

St. Mary's is one of the most beautiful and historic churches in New Orleans. It is also the final resting placed of Blessed Francis Seelos, a Redemptorist priest who ministered to his parish, especially those who were sick and dying of the yellow fever epidemic. Because of heroic care for others, he contracted the illness himself and died of it. His selfless dedication has placed him on the path to sainthood in the Catholic Church.

After 164 years of age and climate—which is hot, humid, and vulnerable to hurricanes—have taken a toll on St. Mary's. As a result, the church has sustained serious damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling.

As stewards of this treasure and being deeply devoted to the legacy of Blessed Francis Seelos, the Redemptorists of the parish are raising the necessary funds to preserve this beautiful church. Their "Save St. Mary's Campaign Committee" is organizing and directing efforts to restore St. Mary's to its original beauty, while fortifying the structure for future generations.
