

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we continue on our journey through the season of Advent, we enter the 3rd Sunday of Advent known as **Gaudete Sunday** and a third candle is lit, the pink candle—and it represents **joy**. It also means, "Rejoice!" It marks the arrival of Jesus at Christmas; this is symbolized by lighting a rose or pink candle on the Advent wreath, instead of purple, representing the *nearness* of salvation, joy, and the message of hope from John the Baptist and the angels to the shepherds. It represents the great joy the shepherds felt at Jesus' birth, as announced by angels, reminding us that true happiness comes from Christ's imminent arrival, even amidst waiting.

During the third week, the first two purple candles (hope & peace) and the third pink candle are lit, signifying the growing joy as Christmas approaches. It's a reminder for us to find joy in God's presence. May Christ fill your hearts with joy and may you share this joy with others. All around the world, believers will light candles on this Sunday to illuminate the darkness and to wait in joyful expectation of our Savior to return. Today, we join all those in lighting the third Advent candle, the pink candle (known as the 'Shepherd's Candle') - in anticipation of the coming of Jesus.

As the season of Advent continues to unfold, there are a few events coming up intended to renew our preparation in waiting for the return of Jesus, our Savior.

December 14th: New Orleans Symphony Chorus will perform Handel's Messiah. For choirs, this concert is the high point of their year. All are invited to join us at St. Mary's Assumption Church at 3pm to enjoy the sounds of the talented Symphony Chorus musicians and singers.

December 24th and 25th: Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. We remember that God, who came as a human being, down to earth, is reborn in our lives and in our world. Join us for Christmas Eve Mass at 4pm at St. Mary's Assumption Church on December 24th. And join us on Christmas Day for 8am Mass at St. Mary's Chapel, and for 10am and 12:30pm Masses at St. Mary's Assumption Church. Please invite your family and friends. All are welcome!



Save St. Mary's Assumption Church – Restoration Capital Campaign

St. Mary's is one of the most beautiful and historic churches in New Orleans. It is also the final resting placed of Blessed Francis Seelos, a Redemptorist priest who ministered to his parish, especially those who were sick and dying of the yellow fever epidemic. Because of heroic care for others, he contracted the illness himself and died of it. His selfless dedication has placed him on the path to sainthood in the Catholic Church. After 164 years of age and climate—which is hot, humid, and vulnerable to storms, and hurricanes—have taken a toll on St. Mary's. As a result, the church has sustained serious damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling. As stewards of this treasure and being deeply devoted to the legacy of Blessed Francis Seelos, the Redemptorists of the parish are raising the necessary funds to preserve this beautiful church. Their "Save St. Mary's Campaign Committee" is organizing and directing its efforts to restore St. Mary's to its original beauty, while fortifying the structure for future generations. We want to thank all those who donated and contributed to our Save St. Mary's Restoration Fund to help pay for the Exterior Renovations of our Church.

We are prayerful and hopeful that we will continue to receive contributions to help fund Phase II, Interior Renovations—to restore the damaged walls and plaster inside of the church, to help repair all of the interior cracks, to preserve the antique plaster carvings, to repaint the interior with historic colors, and other interior renovations as needed.
