LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Merry Christmas and wishing all of you a blessed and joyful Christmas!

As we celebrate the birth of Christ, we remember that God comes to us in humility, hope, and love, especially in times of uncertainty. May the light of the newborn Savior bring peace to your hearts, strength to your families, and renewed faith for the days ahead.

Christmas, at its heart, is not a celebration reserved for easy seasons. It was born in uncertainty, into a world marked by fear, displacement, and discouragement. That alone gives Christmas a quiet power in times of difficulty. When life feels heavy, Christmas reminds us that light does not arrive by erasing darkness, but by entering it. The story speaks of hope choosing humility, of love showing up gracefully, but with presence. In challenging times, this can reframe our expectations: meaning it is not found in everything being fixed, but in knowing we have not been abandoned within what is broken.

Christmas also invites a gentler way of measuring strength. Strength is found in endurance, in kindness that persists when it would be easier to withdraw in faith, or trust that tomorrow can still hold goodness even when today feels uncertain. It is a season that legitimizes small acts: a shared meal, a listening ear, a quiet prayer, a moment of gratitude. These are not insignificant; they are how hope survives.

Perhaps most importantly, Christmas affirms that suffering and joy are not opposites. They can coexist. You can grieve and still receive peace. You can struggle and still be held by love. In that sense, Christmas does not deny pain, rather it dignifies it by insisting that love meets us exactly where we are. Christmas proclaims that God comes precisely when the world feels unstable. The manger becomes a sign that divine love is most present not in trust, perseverance, and quiet faithfulness.

In the midst of our challenging times, the meaning of Christmas becomes clearer, not dimmer. It is the promise that light is present, that love is intentional and even now, especially hope is being born.



Save St. Mary's Assumption Church – Restoration Capital Campaign

St. Mary's is one of the most beautiful and historic churches in New Orleans. It is also the final resting place of Blessed Francis Seelos, a Redemptorist priest who ministered to his parish, especially those who were sick and dying of the yellow fever epidemic. Because of heroic care for others, he contracted the illness himself and died of it. His selfless dedication has placed him on the path to sainthood in the Catholic Church. After 164 years of age and climate—which is hot, humid, and vulnerable to storms, and hurricanes—have taken a toll on St. Mary's. As a result, the church has sustained serious damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling. As stewards of this treasure and being deeply devoted to the legacy of Blessed Francis Seelos, the Redemptorists of the parish are raising the necessary funds to preserve this beautiful church. Their "Save St. Mary's Campaign Committee" is organizing and directing its efforts to restore St. Mary's to its original beauty, while fortifying the structure for future generations. We want to thank all those who donated and contributed to our Save St. Mary's Restoration Fund to help pay for the Exterior Renovations of our Church.

We are prayerful and hopeful that we will continue to receive contributions to help fund Phase II, Interior Renovations—to restore the damaged walls and plaster inside of the church, to help repair all of the interior cracks, to preserve the antique plaster carvings, to repaint the interior with historic colors, and other interior renovations as needed.
