## Celebrate Catholic Schools Week!

Dear Parishioners,

During the week of **January 25—February 1, 2026**, St. Alphonsus School will celebrate National Catholic Schools Week. The theme for this year is **“Catholic Schools: United in Faith and Community.”**

An excerpt from Sister Monica’s letter (from January 2024) on the history of St. Alphonsus School began in 1850 with the construction by Father Chakert, a Redemptorist priest, of a timber building to be used as a school during the week and serve as St. Alphonsus Church on Sundays. The school was established for the English speaking Irish children and staffed by lay teachers until the Sisters of Mercy arrived in New Orleans in 1869.

Jesus said, “Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to them.” The faculty and staff of St. Alphonsus School are dedicated to responding to the needs of the whole child in all aspects of their development; but they have an even deeper calling. Our teachers, support staff, and administrators are called to discipleship, to be powerful witnesses to Gospel values and to the ever-abiding presence of God’s love.

Each morning we pray our **Vision Statement** together as a school family. We ask God to engrave these words into our hearts and to give us the courage to faithfully live these words each day.

**St. Alphonsus School is a place where all involved form a FAMILY which ministers together to provide a loving, safe, Christian environment where all feel accepted and respected and where each member of the family is challenged, encouraged and empowered to develop into a whole person who uses his/her gifts to build up the Kingdom of God. ONE SCHOOL, ONE BODY, ONE GOAL, MAKE US ONE.**

For the past 174 years, under the protection of St. Alphonsus Liguori, the founder of the Redemptorists, and Mother Catherine McAuley, the foundress of the Sisters of Mercy, St. Alphonsus School has been enriched by the cultures and blessed by the faith of Irish, German, French, Italian, Hispanic, and African American families living in the Irish Channel and throughout the city of New Orleans. The history of St. Alphonsus School is a story of a journey of love and dedication between the Redemptorist Community and the Sisters of Mercy. Our St. Alphonsus School Family is deeply grateful to the Redemptorists, the Sisters of Mercy, and the parishioners of St. Alphonsus Parish for their prayers, encouragement, and support during this long journey of the school. Relying on the power of God’s spirit within us, may we continue to be a **beacon of hope** and the opportunity for a Catholic quality education in a loving and faith-filled environment for all the families who enter our doors. May the “Door of St. Alphonsus School” truly be a “Door of Mercy and Plentiful Redemption” that invites all who enter to experience God’s love, God’s healing, and God’s compassion.



## Devotion to Our Mother of Perpetual Help

On June 23, 1867, the same year Blessed Father Francis Seelos died, the icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help was solemnly consecrated in Rome. Pope Pius IX told the Redemptorists to make her image known. The Redemptorists took this commission very seriously and devotion of our Lady under this title spread rapidly throughout the world. Here in New Orleans, 90 years ago, in St. Alphonsus Parish, and the church of St. Mary's Assumption, there were as many as 30,000 people coming to the novena every week. This figure is hard to imagine! There were as many as 10 services in each church throughout the day with buses and streetcars coming at all hours, bringing the vast crowds.

In the Philippines today, over 10,000 people come to Manila for the novena. Our Redemptorist church in Manus, Brazil has almost the same number of people who gather. And over the years, millions of prayers have been answered for those seeking Mary's help.

The history of the icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help is a long and complicated one, but devotion to our Lady is not complicated at all. St. Alphonsus has a very strong devotion to Mary and in one of his many books, *"Visits to the Blessed Sacrament"*, he writes that those who honor Mary and encourage others to do so will be blessed in heaven.

As a Redemptorist priest, I feel called by God and His mother to continue to inspire people with devotion to Mary under the title of Perpetual Help. Here at St. Mary's Assumption Church, we have a shrine in her honor, where thousands have come seeking her help over the years. We celebrate the novena every Tuesday at 7:30am Mass at the Chapel and at 11:30am Mass at St. Mary's Church. We invite and encourage you to take advantage of this opportunity to have our Mother of Perpetual Help intercede for you and your family.

**In June 2026, we plan to honor Our Mother of Perpetual Help on her feast day, on June 27th.** In preparation for this great feast, we plan to publish articles in the church bulletin about this devotion to Mary and other topics. We look forward to your participation in honoring Our Mother of Perpetual Help.

### **Save St. Mary's Assumption Church – Restoration Capital Campaign**

St. Mary's is one of the most beautiful and historic churches in New Orleans. It is also the final resting place of Blessed Francis Seelos, a Redemptorist priest who ministered to his parish, especially those who were sick and dying of the yellow fever epidemic. Because of heroic care for others, he contracted the illness himself and died of it. His selfless dedication has placed him on the path to sainthood in the Catholic Church. After 164 years of age and climate—which is hot, humid, and vulnerable to storms, and hurricanes—have taken a toll on St. Mary's. As a result, the church has sustained serious damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling. As stewards of this treasure and being deeply devoted to the legacy of Blessed Francis Seelos, the Redemptorists of the parish are raising the necessary funds to preserve this beautiful church. Their "Save St. Mary's Campaign Committee" is organizing and directing its efforts to restore St. Mary's to its original beauty, while fortifying the structure for future generations. We want to thank all those who donated and contributed to our Save St. Mary's Restoration Fund to help pay for the Exterior Renovations of our Church.

We are prayerful and hopeful that we will continue to receive contributions to help fund Phase II, Interior Renovations—to restore the damaged walls and plaster inside of the church, to help repair all of the interior cracks, to preserve the antique plaster carvings, to repaint the interior with historic colors, and other interior renovations as needed.
